<p>After an email from matteo on the community list about untranslated button captions:</p> <p>http://lists.osgeo.org/pipermail/qgis-community-team/2014-November/003902.html</p> <p>it appeared to me that indeed in dutch we have the same 'problem', and starting QGIS always shows me:</p> <pre>src/core/qgsmessagelog.cpp: 45: (logMessage) [10ms] 2014-11-17T16:03:32 Qt[1] loading of qt translation failed [usr/share/qt4/translations/qt_nl]</pre> <p>Did some googling, and it appears that qt itself is not fully translated (on Debian, see: /usr/share/qt4/translations), german and japan for example have a qm file there, but dutch and italian do not.</p> <p>From;</p> <p>http://stackoverflow.com/questions/2351055/translate-standardbutton-in-qdialogbuttonbox</p> <p>I had a look, and QGIS tries to load both our own translations, AND the native qt translations:</p> <p>https://github.com/qgis/QGIS/blob/master/src/app/main.cpp#L794:L820</p> <p>So the crux in this is that we (as languages which have 'untranslated buttons') either have to provide the right translations to Qt/Digia/Nokia:</p> <p>ftp://ftp.qt-project.org/qt/110n/index.html</p> <p>and:</p> <p>http://qt-project.org/wiki/Qt-Localization</p> <p>Or we provide our 'own' caption for every button (or button bar) that we provide in a way like:</p> <pre>buttonBox->button(QDialogButtonBox::Ok)->setText(tr("Ok"));</pre> <p>in that way those strings will show up in the translation files of QGIS itself.</p> <p>The last option has as drawback that everywhere where you use some 'standard buttons or button bar' you have to provide the captions yourself.</p> <p>The first option has as drawback that providing the translations to Qt does not mean that those will end up in your distro or qt release</p>		

within a short period.
