<p>When you try to reproject a Raster and the filename has an underline in it you'll get the Error:</p> <p>"ERROR 6: Invalid filename. Must be ABCDEF01.GEN "</p> <p>This occurs not only the filename itself like "test*_01.tiff" but also in the pathname like "C:/User/.../Project*_01/test.tiff"</p> <p>Seems like a rather trivial problem, but we work a lot with underlines on our local server. For now we have to save it in a dummy folder and then copy the file to the actual project folder.</p> <p>This issue is in 2.14. and 2.18 Version</p>
