<b>Description</b>  When using the, Add Vector Layer -> Directory -> Type= "OpenFileGDB" and browsing to a Geodatabase created by ArcGIS, QGIS presents the user with the layers available in the GeoDatabase. However i recently placed a shapefile into my GeoDatabase in windows explorer by accident. When trying to open my Geodatabase using the above method in QGIS i am now only presented with the shapefile that i misplaced even though i selected the "OpenFileGDB" option in the import dialog. It would be nice if QGIS would treat the "folder/Geodatabase" as a geodatabase when "OpenFileGDB" is selected and not as a folder.
