I think we can close this issue, the original issue reported here was most likely due to a non-fusion style (macintosh here) used against a non-default theme (night mapping). Since January 10 - https://github.com/qgis/QGIS/commit/c7abba03fbea84ecf71fd41f0c9bfe27cf65f60c - we enforce the fusion style on non-default themes.

As for possible additional refinements to night mapping, might be worth opening individual tickets to address specific issues.
