However, as far as I can find it has not been.

There is no QGIS 3.4 folder in the C:Program Files folder. There is no shortcut added to the Start menu. When I do a search for qgis-bin then only exectuables that show up are for 2.18 and 3.2.

I have zero clue what is going on.
