This is true when point layer created with Delimited Text plugin. When CSV opened as geometryless layer with Open Vector all works.

With commit:880088c1 (SVN r15704) (and probably older revisions, but I didn't test), moving the CSV file raises a "Handle bad layers" dialog, and allows to find the files created both by Delimited Text and Open Vector.
