<p><i>There might be a trac already for this although I could not find it</i></p> <p>It would be very handy to have expression based labels. This is something that I really miss coming from [[MapInfo]] as I tend to make labels that contain information from more than one column eg [[PipeSize]] + \</p> <p>+ [[PipeType]]</p> <p>I know I can do this by adding a new column however that is limited to tables that I can edit. A lot of our tables are in [[MapInfo]] Tab format for just displaying purposes and because we still use [[MapInfo]] and it would be nice to have something that doesn't require a save to shape and table edit first. So the expression label feature should not need the table to be editable.</p> <p>It would be good if it supported all the operations that the field calculator does eg + * / - and multiline</p>

Sure adding those kinds of things should be pretty easy, it's mainly just a matter of adding them to the QgsExpression class. Martin ala wonder-sk is the guy that can add that stuff in pretty easily as he just redesigned the expression parser.

I think the goal is to have as close to SQL syntax as possible, so we would use UPPER.

FYI: there are already upper(string) and lower(string). For capitalization it seems that initcap(string) is the usual choice for the function name (postgresql, oracle, ms sql). For number formatting I do not know if there is any standard, but keep in mind that some people also would like to specify the number of digits before/after decimal point and optionally add some padding (with zeros or spaces).

The expression based labeling works I'm just cleaning up the UI and the code in order to send a patch.

Nathan, just wondering - is that a completely new dialog? Because currently we have a similar dialog for field calculator (qgsfieldcalculatorbase.ui) and for query builder (qgsquerybuilderbase.ui). This is already suboptimal, so a new dialog should be avoided.

Ideally we should have a reusable widget that provides the text area, list of operators / functions with help, and maybe a way how to get a sample (or all values) from a selected column. Such a widget would be then embedded into all the dialogs that do something with expressions.

Yeah it is a new dialog however it is implemented as a reusable Widget with the intention to use it any where that needs expressions eg QueryBuilder and Field Calculator.

I was going to use the existing ones but they both didn't really serve a generic solution that could be adapted into any situation; they also weren't every expandable with the growing list of functions.

So yes my overall goal with the widget is to replace the others, remove some code logic duplication and create a more uniformed UI.

Ok, that makes sense: to develop a new reusable widget and then use it also for the field calculator and search query builder.

I think you have a good directions, a big grid of buttons with all the operators and functions is not sustainable. Have you done some research how such editor looks in other software? Doing a google image search for "expression editor" yields quite a lot of examples. It would be good to compare them and identify the good, the bad and the ugly ones.

Would it be possible to implement a "substring" operator too? That way, users could reformat date strings from "YYYY-mm-dd" to "dd.mm.YYYY" for example.

I can imagine that with the full list of operators and a large number of fields it could become annoying scrolling up and down repeatedly. It might be slightly better to put Operators, Geometry and Fields on different tabs or something.

There is a real time search at the top that limits the entries to show only stuff with that keyword.

The tab idea is interesting although I worry that you run into a problem of when do you stop making new tabs for lists, the other lists could, in future, get just as big. I added to the search to reduce this problem.
