<p>If you have labeling turned on and right-click on the layer and choose 'Zoom to layer extent', the labels may be cut off, as they are not included in the extent calculation. (To be clear, this is using the PAL labeling in Layer -> Labeling.)</p> <p>I'm not sure this is even a bug, but it does seem slightly counterintuitive.</p>
