### QGIS doesn't remove GRASS mapset lock file after its session

<b>Description</b>	
Steps to reproduce: 1. Start QGIS (from clean console, not from GRASS!) and open existing mapset 2. Close QGIS 3. Start QGIS again and try to open the same mapset which was opened in step 1. Now it's not possible because the mapset is still locked. This happened only if QGIS is not started from GRASS.
